

Pastoral Crisis Intervention 1 Description

Pastoral Crisis Intervention may be thought of as the combination of faith-based resources with traditional techniques of crisis intervention. Pastoral crisis intervention represents a powerful addition to traditional community and organizational psychological support resources. The purpose of this two-day course is to assist the participants in learning how pastoral interventions and traditional psychological crisis interventions may be effectively integrated.

Chaplains, pastoral counselors, mental health professionals, ministers, and anyone interested in the use of faith-based resources in healing should find this course of interest.

- “Crisis of faith” vs. cry of distress

Pastoral Crisis Intervention 2 Description

This course builds on the foundations of ICISF’s “Pastoral Crisis Intervention” class. More specific advanced concepts and specific field applications where pastoral crisis intervention is applied will be covered.

Prerequisite: ICISF’s “Pastoral Crisis Intervention” course. Confirmation of full attendance in ICISF’S course “Pastoral Crisis Intervention” is a prerequisite to attend this class. A copy of your certificate for ICISF’s “Pastoral Crisis Intervention” class indicating full attendance (13 Contact Hours) must be submitted with registration form. If registering and attending Pastoral Crisis Intervention and Pastoral Crisis Intervention II at same conference there is no need to send in confirmation of prerequisite.

- PCI with those expressing suicidal ideation
- PCI with those experiencing acute bereavement
- Principles of death notification
- The incident management system
- Principles and practices associated with self-care

Rev. Julie Taylor, MDiv, CTR , (Certified Trauma Responder), specializes in critical incident response, trauma, and disaster spiritual care. She is the executive director of Disaster Chaplaincy Services, located in New York City. During the 9/11 recovery, Rev. Taylor was a chaplain at St. Paul's Chapel at the World Trade Center site and has continued to respond to local and national crises including floods, building collapses, US Airways Flt 1549 Emergency Landing, and the fatal shooting at the Tennessee Valley Unitarian Universalist Church in Knoxville, Tennessee. In addition to her work with Disaster Chaplaincy Services, Rev. Taylor serves as a member of the Hudson Valley CISM Team and the Unitarian Universalist Trauma Response Ministry.

Rev. Taylor is the author of the chapter "Spiritual First Aid" in the book, *Disaster Spiritual Care: Practical Clergy Responses to Community, Regional and National Tragedy*, the first comprehensive resource for pastoral care in the face of disaster. She is a Certified Trauma Responder through the Association of Traumatic Stress Specialists (ATSS), and a member of the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF). She is an ICISF Approved Instructor and received her Master's of Divinity from Union Theological Seminary in the City of New York.
